[Update] Client A0002 was mentioned in the October 2016 newsletter who was desperately in need of alternative housing. Our "system" has repeatedly failed this client. The guardian has gotten the client's medication adjusted and had the client re-assessed, more than doubling caregiver hours. The client reports much relief after the roommate moved out. The client had funds to cover his rent and utilities for February but will need assistance in March. The guardian has applied to a local service agency for rent assistance. The Guardian Institute will assist with any difference once the amount awarded from the local service agency. The client is now at the top of the list for low income housing so we hope that it will not be long before getting him settled.

Client A0003—Clallam County

Short-term Low interest loan awarded: \$3,000.00

Client A0003 is on Medicaid and has a house that needs to be sold. However, the contents of the house needs to be removed in order to be able to get a quicker sale and to ask a higher price. The Guardian Institute Board has approved a short term loan, to be paid back at the sale of the home, for this purpose.

HELP WANTED—APPRENTICE OR INTERN GUARDIAN

THE BUSINESS OF GUARDIANSHIP, PART IV

Working Efficiently

Any business owner knows that time is money. The challenge is how to work the most efficiently. During the early days, while still struggling to grow the business into a viable money-maker, the business owner is focused more on getting new business in the door; but as the business matures, a business owner needs to critically assess how time is being used and develop policies and procedures for the employer and employees so that everyone can work more efficiently. As a small business, working "lean" is essential to the survival of the business.

We at Bridge Builders, Ltd have spent a lot of time critically assessing how to work more efficiently. To begin with I developed a simple excel spreadsheet and told everyone, including me, to document all their time, billable

and non-billable time. The unexpected consequence of this was that I lost a few employees. As it turned out, these employees were not billing all the time they spent with clients or accounting for all the time I was paying them to work. One employee couldn't understand why this was a problem because she didn't charge the business for the time she spent with the clients and that she didn't put the time on her timesheet. She just didn't understand that as an employee of Bridge Builders, Ltd, she represented the company, on the clock or off the clock, and if something bad happened during this "volunteer" time, Bridge Builders, Ltd was liable. It was also essentially stealing money from the business and setting a bad precedent with clients. I then made a policy that no employee can see any clients without my knowledge and approval. This doesn't mean that they must officially ask permission each time they want to visit a client. We have a shared calendar where I can see who is scheduled to see whom. If it is something last minute, an employee will just tell me where she is going or leave me an email. We continue to use the spreadsheet. My employees usually know what is billable but if one of them isn't sure, she just changes the font color to red so that I know to review it. The nice thing with excel is that I can sort several different ways and total the billable hours on a weekly basis. I have target totals for each week and if the billable time is lagging behind, I will tell my employees to focus on billable time and as much as possible leave the non-billable tasks for later. It is amazing how this can improve the numbers.

We have a staff meeting every Monday morning to review all our "active" clients. Bridge Builders, Ltd does more than guardianship and many of our clients are served on an "as needed" basis. I pass out a list of the clients and we go down the list and bring each other up-to-date on any changes, problems or improvements. We also work out a plan if a client is in crisis or there is a problem. These plans can always be adjusted but it helps to have a general plan. We decide which clients need to be visited that week and assign who is to visit whom. This makes the week go more smoothly. Our goal is to have our clients as stable as possible by Friday as that makes the weekend nicer for whoever is on call.

We have "emergency files" on all our active clients. These files include the following: Client profile with the client's personal information, doctors information, insurance information, family & friends information; a copy of our legal documents for the client (Letters of Guardianship or Power of Attorney); copy of the Order Appointing the Guardian if the guardianship is limited; copy of the Standby Guardian document; Copy of the medical cards, Copy of the picture ID, Copy of the healthcare directive and/or POLST; and we put a pocket in the back to hold their insurance cards and picture ID if we have them. If they live independently, we include a copy of their diagnoses and medication list. If a client has a medical appointment or goes to the hospital, instead of rifling through files to find this information, we basically have it at our fingertips. We have a designated file drawer just for these files, which makes it much easier to find them. More recently, we have focused on having most of our documents scanned into our computer. It's much easier to find documents on the computer than looking through paper files to find something. We each have a Scan Snap [brand name] scanner at our desk. They are on the pricey side at around \$500 each but they are fast feeder scanners and have paid for themselves many times over in saving us time in filing (non-essential documents are scanned into the computer and shredded instead of filed). If someone calls requesting information it is now rare that we must spend time going through the paper files to find the information as it is at our fingertips. Make sure that you have a hard drive back up as well as a cloud back up.

We are located in a rural community. The next town is a thirty-minute drive so we have developed a policy that if anyone is going to the next town, that person asks the others if there is anything that needs to delivered or if something else needs to be done. Before returning to Sequim, that person calls the office to see if there is anything that has come up that can be done before returning to the office. Since the only hospital is in the next town, if we learn that a client is being transported to the hospital, whoever is already in that town can swing by the hospital to check on the client.

As Bridge Builders, Ltd has grown, our phones ring quite a lot. Mostly, callers want to talk with Brenda or me. In order to keep us from being interrupted all day, the bookkeeper or that care manager answers the phone first and screens the call. Often, they can answer simple questions. If the caller insists on talking with Brenda or me, the staff who answers the phone will ask what the call is regarding. If my staff can tell me what the caller wants, often I can just verbally give my staff person the answer instead of taking the call. This saves Brenda and me a lot of time.
