It can take several tries before finding the right person and approach for a client with social and intellectual challenges.

# Client A0002—Clallam County

[Update] Client A0002 was mentioned in the October 2016 newsletter who was desperately in need of alternative housing. Our "system" has repeatedly failed this client. The guardian has gotten the client's medication adjusted and had the client re-assessed, more than doubling caregiver hours. The roommate has moved out leaving this client with full rent and utilities. The guardian has applied to a local service agency for rent assistance. The Guardian Institute will assist with any difference once the amount awarded from the local service agency. The client is now at the top of the list for low income housing so we hope that it will not be long before getting him settled.

# HELP WANTED—APPRENTICE OR INTERN GUARDIAN

Bridge Builders, Ltd provides quality guardianship, care management and fiduciary services on the North Olympic Peninsula and is looking for a candidate who would like to become certified as a Certified Professional Guardian.

The candidate would need to reside in Clallam, Jefferson or Kitsap counties, be provisionally certified by the Certified Professional Guardian Board as a condition of employment. The chosen individual would work on a part-time and per diem basis as an apprentice guardian until receiving certification as a professional guardian. Bridge Builders, Ltd would negotiate a reimbursement plan for the costs associated with becoming certified as a professional guardian. Upon certification, the candidate would be able to have a separate personal guardianship caseload and contract with Bridge Builders, Ltd to provide guardianship services for them.

# THE BUSINESS OF GUARDIANSHIP, PART IV

# Tips for Promoting Your Business

Promoting a new business can be frustrating. When I was in the early days of building Bridge Builders, Ltd I would often hear from potential referral sources that they wanted to see my results before they would refer to me. But how could I produce any results without getting referrals?! Through trial and error I figured out what works and what doesn't when it comes to promoting one's business:

# **Appearance**

• Always have good personal hygiene. Shower regularly, wash your hair, brush your teeth. This may seem like common sense but you would be surprised at how often this is overlooked.

- Dress professionally. As a CPG dress similar to attorneys that you know. In court, make sure that you wear a suit jacket. If you are mistaken for an attorney while you are waiting for your court hearing, you are on the right track.
- Be pleasant. Smile. Have good eye contact. Have a firm handshake.

# **Professional Business Practices**

- Have a separate cell phone for work and answer it in a professional manner. For example: "Good morning/ afternoon, [business name], this is [your first name].
- Be accessible. Answer non-emergent calls within 24-hour. Answer emergent calls as quickly as possible.

# Have a "presence", meaning a physical office.

• If you are solo practice and work out of your home, find a place where you can purchase office space by the hour so that you can meet with clients and others. Many cities have these type of offices for rent.

# Have the goal of being known as an expert on guardianship; the process not the specifics of the law

- Be willing to talk with individuals about the process of petitioning a guardianship and what they can expect during the process.
- Present talks about professional guardianship at meetings of providers or offer a community based presentation.
- Be willing to brainstorm less restrictive alternatives with family, when applicable.

# **Networking**

- Send a letter of introduction to guardians ad litem or those who have the job of determining the guardian for individuals.
- Ask for informational interviews with attorneys who practice elder law.
- Join your local Chamber of Commerce. (You'd be amazed at how many attorneys attend Chamber of Commerce meetings)
- Join a service club.
- Contact the local County Courts to introduce self as a new CPG.
- Seek local Guardianship attorneys, set appointments to introduce self keep it brief, 5 minutes or less unless the attorney has provided you with a specific time slot. Some attorneys will offer assistance on the process and steps to be successful.
- Join a local chapter of the Bar and attend meetings, many offer CEU's in conjunction with their meetings.

# **Advertising**

- Press Releases (free). The idea is to get your name in print as much as possible. Publish a press release announcing your appointment as a CPG by the Supreme Court, each time you attend a continuing education event, any time you join a new club or other non-profit entity.
- NGA publications. The NGA is always looking for news to publish. Send your press release to them as well.
- Local newspaper. Write an article for the local newspaper. Send in a comment on an article that was published.
- Other trade publications. WAPG may accept press released or articles. The Guardian Institute certainly does.
- Business Cards Always have business cards. Make it a goal to give out at leave five a day.
- Donate to a non-profit. Even a small donation gets your name published.
